



## “Winter Wonderland” Celebrates Holidays and Traditions in Annual Cultural Exhibit

**ATLANTA — Nov. 5 —** “Winter Wonderland: Celebrations & Traditions Around the World” returns to Fernbank Museum from Nov. 22, 2025 – Jan. 11, 2026. This seasonal exhibit features two floors of unique trees and displays that highlight cultural celebrations, traditions and events from across the globe.

Created in partnership with more than 30 local consulates and cultural organizations, Fernbank’s “Winter Wonderland” offers twinkling lights and a shining variety of cultural objects, recognizing cultural traditions in countries from North America, South America, Africa, Europe and Asia. This exhibit tells stories from around the world through arts, crafts, symbols and vibrant ornamental decor. From widely celebrated winter festivities to lesser-known traditions, guests will get a joyful glimpse into the many ways people come together to celebrate.

Some of the countries featured in this year’s display include Japan, Scotland, Kenya, Turkey, Ukraine, Argentina, Guatemala, Canada, Philippines, and many more.

“This is Fernbank’s 16th annual Winter Wonderland exhibition, and we are excited to once again work with our many community partners to showcase these unique displays,” said Dr. Bobbi Hohmann, Fernbank’s VP of Programming and Collections. “This exhibit provides many opportunities for our guests to learn about cultural traditions and the cultural diversity that is represented in Atlanta and across the globe.”

Guests will have the chance to view “Winter Wonderland: Celebrations & Traditions Around the World” while following a themed scavenger hunt for an exciting exploration. The scavenger hunt will challenge guests to discover ornaments and objects within the exhibit. Copies of the scavenger hunt are available near the beginning of the exhibition.

“Winter Wonderland” can also be enjoyed on select evenings during the nighttime experience, WildWoods: AGLOW, which returns from Nov. 14 through Feb. 28, 2026.

“Winter Wonderland” is included with general admission at Fernbank and with CityPASS. General admission tickets include three floors of exhibits in the natural history museum, choice of one giant screen film, and 75 acres of nature explorations in Fernbank Forest and WildWoods. Fernbank After Dark, WildWoods: AGLOW and some other special after-hours events are available at a separate ticket price. Fernbank is located at 767 Clifton Road NE in Atlanta, minutes from midtown Atlanta and downtown Decatur.

General admission tickets are \$25.95 for adults, \$24.95 for seniors, \$23.95 for children ages 3-12, free for children ages 2 and younger, and free for Fernbank Members. These prices are for tickets purchased online at FernbankMuseum.org. Tickets not purchased in advance are offered onsite, if available, at a higher price.
